



Our belief that Heaven will be boring betrays a heresy—that God is boring. There is no greater nonsense. God is the source of all joy... Heaven will be the opposite of boredom.

The idea that Heaven will be boring stems from Satan's lies. He portrays Heaven as dull, white, and floaty, because he knows that if we believe that, we'll be unmotivated to pursue it.



Bishop Wescott, an Anglican Bible scholar in the 19th century wrote "The eternal does not, in essence, express the infinite extension of time, but the absence of time not the omnitemporal, but the supratemporal." Something omnitemporal would be within time. Supratemporal means beyond time—existing outside the bounds of time itself. So, when the Bible speaks of eternal life, it's not just saying "you'll live a really long time," but "you'll participate in the kind of life that belongs to God—life that transcends time."

We know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands.

- 2 CORINTHIANS 5:1 -

Why will you die?


What is the resurrection of the body?

There are heavenly bodies and earthly bodies, but the glory of the heavenly is of one kind, and the glory of the earthly is of another. There is one glory of the sun, and another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars; for star differs from star in glory. So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable.
